I. PURPOSE

The agreement between the University of Pittsburgh and the Community College of Philadelphia establishes a mechanism for graduates with an Associate in Applied Science in Dental/Assisting Hygiene from the Community College of Philadelphia to complete requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene from the College of General Studies, University of Pittsburgh.

Completion of the Bachelor Degree Program application.

Upon successful completion of the specified courses in the Dental Hygiene Program with a 2.25 overall QPA, students transfer to the College of General Studies. No additional records will be required to be submitted by the students to the College of General Studies.

VII. PERIODIC REVIEW

The Office of the Director, Dental Hygiene Program, and Office of the Dean, College of General Studies, University of Pittsburgh, will review this agreement annually and in consultation with Department Head, Dental Assisting Hygiene, Community College of Philadelphia, make any minor revisions needed. Significant changes require the approval of the Dean, College of General studies, and the Dean, Business, Science and Technology, Community College of Philadelphia.

VIII. TERMINATION OF THE AGREEMENT
