ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

By and Between

SCHOOL OF HEALTH RELATED PROFESSIONS, UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH - OF THE COMMONWEALTH SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION - a Pennsylvania not-for-profit corporation with its principal offices located at 4200 Fifth Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15260, hereinafter referred to as "University";

AND

COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF ALLEGHENY COUNTY, ALLEGHENY CAMPUS, a Pennsylvania not-for-profit corp. with its principal offices located at College Office, 800 Allegheny Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15233 through its Allied Health Department of Natural Sciences, hereinafter referred to as "CCAC".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, CCAC wishes to provide its Allied Health Department students with an opportunity to continue their education without unnecessary duplication of instruction and delay in attaining education/career objectives; and

WHEREAS, University wishes to recognize CCAC students qualified for admission and advanced standing in specific programs in its School of Health Related Professions;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto intending to be legally bound do hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. COVENANTS

1.01 CCAC covenants as follows:

- A. CCAC agrees that in order for its Allied Health Department students to qualify for consideration for admission and advanced standing in the School of Health Related Professions at the University as a Health Records Administration major the CCAC student must fulfill the following conditions:
 - They must have completed an Associate of Science degree and prerequisite courses which are outlined in Exhibit A, earned a minimum overall quality point average of 2.50 (based on a 4.0 scale) and a prerequisite quality point average of at least 2.50; and completed all application procedures required by the University of Pittsburgh and the School of Health Related Professions.

- 2) In order to be awarded advanced standing credit, a "C" grade or higher must be earned in each course that is included in the Associate degree program in Medical Record Technician (MRT) (see Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference).
- A transfer student from CCAC-Allegheny Campus will be awarded a baccalaureate degree from the University of Pittsburgh upon completion of the courses outlined in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, according to the graduation requirements of the Program in Health Records Administration in the School of Health Related Professions at the University of Pittsburgh.
- B. CCAC understands that University is not guaranteeing admission or the reservation of a specified number of openings for CCAC students.
- 1.02 University Covenants as follows:
- A. University agrees to consider CCAC Allied Health Department students who have completed all application procedures required by the University of Pittsburgh and the School of Health Related Professions and completed all prerequisite courses as set forth in provision 1.01 A. above, for admission and advanced standing in University's School of Health Related Professions.

ARTICLE II. TERM AND TERMINATION

- 2.01. This Agreement shall be effective on the date first above written and shall be in existence for a period of two (2) years. The Agreement may be renewed for subsequent two (2) year terms if both parties agree to such in writing at least thirty (30) days prior to the termination date.
- 2.02. This Agreement may be terminated by either party without cause upon one (1) academic year's written notice.

ARTICLE III. NOTICES

3.01. Any notices to be given hereunder shall be in writing and deemed to be sufficiently given when mailed by first-class, certified or registered mail to the following addresses:

ARTICLE IV. MODIFICATION

4.01. This Agreement sets forth the entire understanding between the parties as to the subject matter hereof. Any modification or amendment to this Agreement shall be in writing and signed by the parties hereto.

ARTICLE V. GOVERNING LAW

5.01. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
